***PLATO is case sensitive. Use capitol and small letters as shown**

Once into your program, follow these steps:

- Click on the green lettering that says “PLATO eduTest Simulated Test System”.
- Click on Test Administration
- Click on District Tests
- Decide if you want to start with Language Arts (reading and writing) or Math.
- Click on the word “Adult”.
- You will see two tests for each subject area. You take one now (exemptive test) and one after you have completed the tutorials (non-exemptive test).
- Once you have completed the first assessment, a tutorial program will be generated for you and will show up on your home page.

Helpful Hints:

- ❖ **Pop-up Blocker must be disabled to view lessons.**
- ❖ **When working from home, you may be asked to download some additional features on your home system for Platoweb to work properly, Click “Yes” to all messages during download.**
- ❖ **AOL Browser is not recommended. If you do connect through AOL, minimize and use another browser like Explorer.**
- ❖ **Use the PLATO Navigation tools before using Browser Tool bar.**
- ❖ **Remember to click log-out when you are finished a user session.**
- ❖ **For Assessment - in some cases you will need to begin again if you quit in the middle of a session, in other instances, you may be able to “un-lock” by returning to the lesson.**

To get information about PRAXIS scores:

- Click on “PRAXIS” from the list
- Click on “About The Test”
- Click on “PRAXIS 1 Overview”
- Click on the menu tab that says “Scores”
- Click on “Interpreting Your Scores”
- Click on “State Requirements” (at bottom of page)
- Find NH from the list and click

Here you will find qualifying scores for the PRAXIS, both computerized and paper/pencil. Keep these scores in mind when evaluating the results of your PPST (practice PRAXIS).

How to see your score from the PLATO practice test?

- Get into your account
- Click again on “PLATO eduTest Simulated Test System”.
- Click on “Report Browser”
- Click on “View District Test Results”

You will not see scores on your PLATO report similar to those you will receive on the actual PRAXIS. What you WILL see are percentage of accuracy scores. Your goal is to achieve 80 to 85% accuracy on your practice tests. This should give you a sense of confidence that you will do well on the actual exam.
