

# MASSAGE THERAPY

## Certificate

Massage therapy is one of the oldest healthcare practices known. Over the years, it has become essential to conventional, complementary and alternative healthcare environments. Great Bay's Certificates (750 hours) curriculum is approved by the State of New Hampshire Massage Therapy Board, The National Certification Board of Therapeutic Massage and Bodywork and by the State of New Hampshire Department of Education, Post-Secondary Education Division.

Upon successful completion, students will be prepared to take the Massage and Bodywork Licensing Exam (MBLEx), which is required by the state of New Hampshire and many other states for licensure. NH requires a minimum of 750 hours of Massage Therapy curriculum.



The Massage Therapy Certificate Program is designed to be completed in 3 semesters (within one year) during the day (Fall start only) or evening (Spring start only). Students must attend full time to continue in the program; part time attendance is not allowed.

While enrolled in the Massage Therapy Certificate at GBCC, students are granted a free membership to the American Massage Therapy Association (AMTA). AMTA offers the strongest benefits in the Massage Therapy profession. Some of the amazing benefits that students could receive are:
