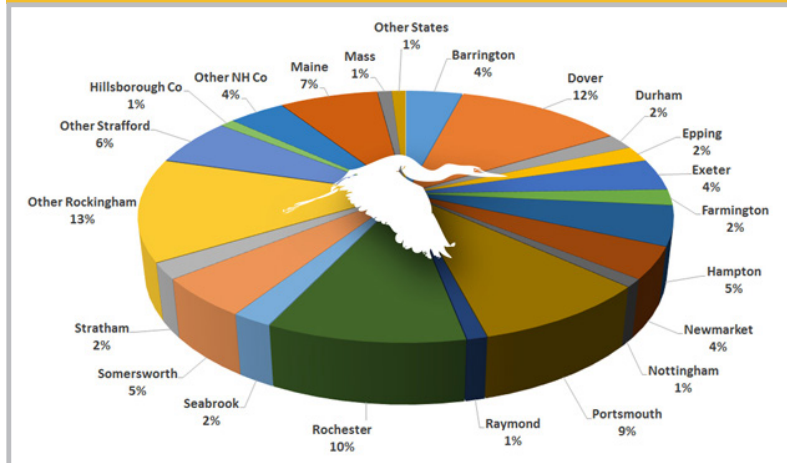

Project Running Start

The Project Running Start Program is a unique higher education initiative for high school students. College courses are offered during the day at participating high schools.

Benefits for the student:

- Gain experience in college-level work and expectations
- Receive college and high school credit
- Earn college credits at a fraction of college tuition
- College credits may be transferred to many two-year and four-year colleges across the country.
- Pay no application fees when applying to CCSNH colleges

Transfer and Articulation Agreements

As a comprehensive community college, Great Bay has developed partnerships with public and private four-year institutions both in and out of New Hampshire.

The New Hampshire Transfer Connections Program allows students to start their education at Great Bay Community College in the Liberal Arts program and transfer to any of the University System of NH colleges or universities. Those include Plymouth State University, Granite State College, Keene State College, the University of New Hampshire, and the University of New Hampshire at Manchester.
